Resolutions of Positions

- I. Concerning Catholicism: We of the IMBF are resolved that Catholicism as a system is in error and does not represent biblical Christianity. Though there may be legitimately saved people who have not left the Catholic religion, we would expect that the Holy Spirit would lead them out of the system.
- II. Concerning Israel: We of the IMBF are resolved that Israel is God's chosen people. They were chosen unto service, not unto salvation. Therefore, the individual Israelite must come to Christ for salvation just like any Gentile (Rom. 2:9–11; Rom. 10:12). Israel as a nation remains God's chosen people, as the covenant that God made with them is an everlasting covenant (Gen. 17:7, 19). Israel will, after the rapture of the church, come back into focus as the vessel of God's working on earth. Thus, Israel as a nation deserves the support of every believer, though as a secular nation their every action may not be biblically supported.
- III. We of the IMBF, as a Fellowship, reaffirm and recommit ourselves to the preaching of the Gospel of Jesus Christ for the salvation of the lost.
